SUNDAY REFLECTION:

In today's Gospel, we get a glimpse into the heart of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. After the Apostles had returned from their ministry, Jesus invites the Apostles go to a deserted place to rest a while. Yet even in this deserted place, a crowd follows Jesus and seeks Him out. WHY PRAY THE ROSARY?

The Rosary is a devotional prayer.

- 1) It is embodied, concrete, objective. Holding the beads can put you in a mystical frame of mind.
- 2) It is a way of disciplining the mind for meditation, to move to the deep realms of the soul. The repetition quiets the mind and allows the depths of the soul to rise.
- 3) It slows us down. The soul likes to go slow. The deep spiritual center likes to see, hear and savor.

When we pray, we move in a circle – to meditate upon the great Christian ministries, to look at the icons of Jesus' birth, suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension from a variety of angles. This slow pray, the deep soul loves to do.

With the Rosary we come together in prayer and common purpose. So join us in praying the Rosary before Sunday mass.
